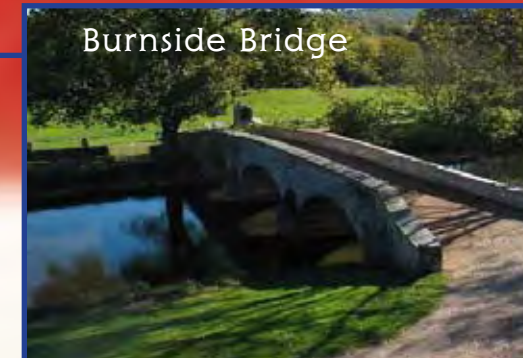

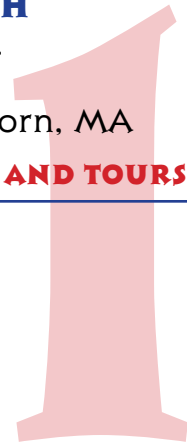

PROGRAM INFORMATION

TUITION

Tuition for programs is \$1,400 per person \$700 is due upon acceptance, with balance due at registration. The tuition covers accommodations (hotel or at Freedoms Foundation), admissions, tour transportation, instruction, and one graduate credit hour. Meals are not included for American Revolution South or Civil War East; some meals are provided for Revolution in the Middle States. Participants are responsible for transportation to and from the program.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Through the generosity of the MJ MURDOCK CHARITABLE TRUST, scholarships are available for qualified teachers from the following states: ALASKA • IDAHO • MONTANA • OREGON • WASHINGTON. A limited number of scholarships are available on a first-come, first-served basis for teachers from other states thanks to many other supporting organizations and foundations.

ACCREDITATION

Each tour program includes one graduate credit hour, which is granted by Immaculata University (www.immaculata.edu) in Immaculata, PA. Enrolled students who wish to earn either two or three credits must pay \$100 for each additional hour directly to Immaculata University at the beginning of the program. Auditors are admitted only by special arrangement.
